

Job Description - Full Time Traineeship

Certificate in Agriculture (Beef Cattle Production)

Employment Conditions

Trainees:

- are employed full time under a traineeship
- are recruited by RITE and then matched to a suitable cattle property / station
- live on the station where they are employed and all meals and accommodation are supplied

Job Description

Station duties may include:

- cattle mustering/handling
- vehicle / motorbike operation & maintenance
- maintenance of property water supplies
- & other general station work
- horsemanship
- fencing
- welding

Training & Assessment

Training & Assessment takes place:

- on the property (delivered by a RITE Field Officer)
- at Training Blocks – usually held twice a year for 1-2 weeks, trainees come together at a RITE approved training property to attend training sessions and complete assessments

Qualifications

Trainees can undertake the following qualifications:

- **Certificate II in Agriculture (Beef Cattle Production)**
 - Preferred entry level traineeship
 - Can be completed in approximately 12 months
- **Certificate III in Agriculture (Beef Cattle Production)**
 - More advanced level traineeship
 - Can be completed in approximately 2 years



Prerequisites

- A good work ethic and attitude
- Good standard of health & fitness
- High energy level
- Basic knowledge of the rural industry
- Experience is an advantage

Wages

- Wages are paid under the Station Hands Award (State)
- Board & Keep is factored into the wage and provided by the host property
- Trainees may be entitled to a Living Away From Home Allowance (*for more details on LAFHA contact your New Apprenticeship Centre*)

Fees

Queensland Government funded traineeship (one level only)

- Certificate II – no fees apply
- Certificate III – a small tuition fee applies

User Pays traineeship - If you have already complete a qualification and wish to undertake another one course fees may apply.

Career Prospects

The Certificate in Agriculture is well recognized across the rural industry. Upon completion graduates will find their skills are in high demand. Over 80% of Queenslanders who have completed a qualification at Certificate II or III are employed and Certificate II and III qualifications may also be used to gain entry into University courses.

- Overseas agricultural industries
- Consultancy
- Peak Bodies (such as AgForce, NFF, Cattle Concil, MLA)
